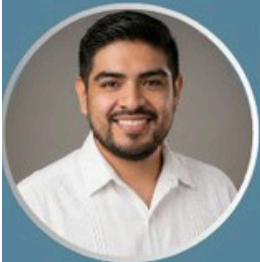

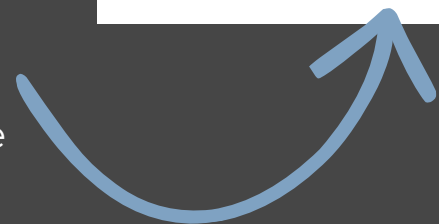

# COMMITTEES & RIIG UPDATES

## BioBehavioral RIIG

The SNRS Biobehavioral RIIG continues to advance nursing science through innovative, collaborative research. At the recent SNRS Conference, the team presented findings demonstrating that higher metabolic inflammatory burden is significantly associated with poorer mental health among midlife women, underscoring the importance of biologically informed approaches to mental health care. Leveraging All of Us Research Program data, this work highlights the group's commitment to rigorous, data driven inquiry with meaningful clinical implications. Building on this momentum, the RIIG is now actively preparing the manuscript for publication, further extending the impact of this important research.



# COMMITTEES & RIIG UPDATES

## Qualitative RIIG

The qualitative RIIG was established in December 2024 under the leadership of Dr. Doncy Eapen, Chair, and Dr. Alasia Ledford, Co-Chair. The RIIG currently has approximately 33 members, including doctoral students and early-, mid-, and senior-career nurse scientists who share a strong commitment to qualitative research.

Although we are only approaching our one-year anniversary, the RIIG has already achieved several important milestones. These include an editorial currently under review, a webinar completed in August 2025, a second webinar planned for December 2025, and a symposium accepted for presentation at the upcoming SNRS Annual Conference.

We meet monthly, and our meetings are consistently productive. We are fortunate to have a vibrant group of nurse scientists who are actively engaged in a wide range of RIIG initiatives.

Occupational Health Nurses' Knowledge, Attitudes, and Perceptions Towards Their Scope of Practice and Related Issues Study.

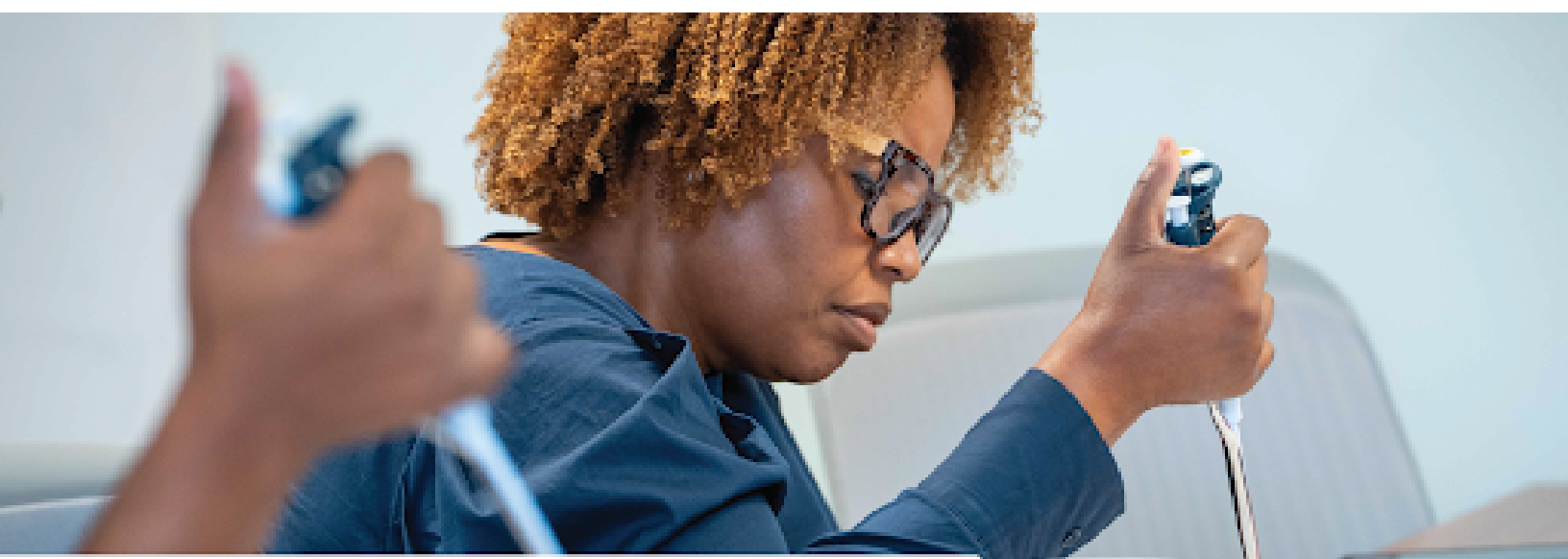
I am a Ph.D. student in nursing seeking occupational health nurses to participate in a research study. The purpose of this research is to explore and understand occupational health nurses' knowledge of their scope of practice, their attitudes towards it, and how they perceive their scope of practice and related issues. Participating in this study is voluntary, and you can stop at any time if you choose to.

However, I wish that you would fully participate to completion, as sharing your experiences significantly contributes to the advancement of occupational health nursing through research and adds to the body of literature and knowledge. This involves participating in a single Zoom interview from a location convenient to you, which will last 45 to 60 minutes. A follow-up interview may be necessary to clarify any information obtained during the interview.

You are eligible to participate if you are an occupational health nurse practicing in the Washington, DC/Maryland/Virginia tri-state area with a registered nurse license, who is not a nurse practitioner and has at least one year of occupational health nursing experience. Participants will receive a \$30 electronic gift card as an incentive for participating in the interview.
